Can I withhold rent when my landlord wont resolve an issue?

When a tenant withholds rent as a form of retaliation, it can lead to eviction and the potential loss of certain rights.

How much can my landlord raise my rent at a time?

In Texas, there is no statewide law that places limits on how much a landlord can increase the rent when a lease is renewed.

What is considered an emergency when it comes to repairs?

Emergency repairs are repairs that impact health and safety, such as: running water/hot water, heating/air conditioning, stove/refrigerator/oven, electricity, bathroom use, missing doors/locks/windows, or pests.



Looking to move? Watch out for rental listing scams!

Sometimes, property listings can be fraudulent and lead to scams if you're not vigilant. Our partner, **BALANCE**, provides 10 warning signs to watch for in scam listings.

- 1. The listing shows up with varying contact information
- 2. The price is absurdly low
- 3. They want all of your information immediately
- 4. Being asked to pay anything before seeing the apartment
- 5. You're asked to pay rent or a security deposit before signing a lease
- 6. The payment method is fishy
- 7. Everything is rushed
- 8. There's no one to meet with
- 9. Something major changes
- 10. The lease has missing information
